Why We Wear a Uniform

At Brownell Talbot, our uniform serves as more than just a dress code. It's a visible expression of our shared community and values. By wearing a standardized set of clothing, we establish a unified identity that reinforces our sense of belonging and keeps the focus on learning and relationships rather than individual clothing choices. A clear uniform policy ensures that everyone can direct their energy toward what matters most: the exceptional educational experience that defines BT.

As students progress through the divisions, they are given increasing choice along with greater responsibility to understand what professional dress looks like in college and beyond. Lower School students dress for active, hands-on learning with practical comfort in mind. Middle School students find common ground between structure and independence. Upper School students navigate more refined formal uniform expectations while exercising greater autonomy on daily uniform days, preparing them to dress appropriately for the varied contexts they'll encounter in their futures.

The Fine Print

Students must maintain a neat and clean appearance at all times.
Clothing must be in good repair and fit properly.

Each division has guidelines specific to its students. These policies can be found in each division's section of the Student/Family Handbook and in this style book. The administration will render the final decision on the interpretation of these guidelines.

Tops

- Solid white long- or short-sleeve polo shirt with collar (must be tucked in; school logo is optional)
- *Optional:* Logo'ed Brownell Talbot uniform crewneck sweatshirt (must be worn with required polo shirt)

Bottoms

- Solid navy uniform pants OR
- Solid navy Bermuda-style shorts OR
- Navy skirt or skort
- Black or brown belt required if pants/shorts have belt loops

Footwear & Accessories

- Athletic shoes that complement the uniform
- White, black, or navy socks (brand logos on socks permitted)
- *Optional:* White, black, or navy tights or tapered leggings (no flared leggings)
- *Optional:* Snow/rain boots may be brought for outdoor play

Lower School Kindergarten - Grade 4

The Fine Print: Formal Uniform

Note: Early Years students do not have a formal dress uniform.

Tops

- Solid white long- or short-sleeve dress shirt (must be tucked in)
- *Required October – March:* Solid navy long-sleeve sweater, cardigan, or sweater vest

Bottoms

- Solid navy dress pants OR
- Brownell Talbot plaid jumper
- Black or brown belt required if pants have belt loops

Footwear & Accessories

- Athletic shoes that complement the uniform
- White, black, or navy socks (brand logos on socks permitted)
- *Optional:* White, black, or navy tights or tapered leggings (no flared leggings)

The Fine Print: Outerwear

Students may wear a coat between buildings. Coats and jackets are to be removed after entering a classroom, the dining hall, or any other instructional space.

Any decision regarding the acceptability of school uniform items will be at the sole discretion of school administration.

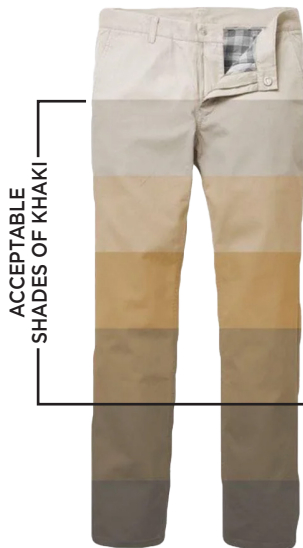

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Middle School

Grades 7-8 Competition Day Dress Code

Students participating in athletics and activities with approved team shirts or jerseys may wear them on competition days with:

- Khaki pants with black or brown belt OR
- Brownell Talbot plaid skirt
- Shoes that complement the uniform (boots, flip flops, slides, and sandals are not permitted)

Note: On Wednesdays, formal uniform is required until after Chapel.

Formal dress options are also acceptable for daily wear.

Tops

- Solid navy long- or short-sleeve polo shirt (must be tucked in and match provided color swatches; school logo is optional)
- *Optional:* Logo'd Brownell Talbot uniform crewneck sweatshirt from the Raider Market (must be worn over required polo shirt)

Bottoms

- Solid khaki pants with black or brown belt OR
- Khaki Bermuda-style shorts with black or brown belt OR
- Plaid uniform skirt or skort

Footwear & Accessories

- Shoes that complement the uniform (boots, flip flops, slides, and sandals are not permitted)
- White, black, or navy socks (brand logos on socks permitted)
- *Optional:* White, black, or navy tights or tapered leggings (no flared leggings)

Students may continue wearing light blue polos and navy pants purchased before January 13, 2026, through the end of the 2026-2027 school year. All polos purchased on or after January 13, 2026, must be navy blue, and all pants must be khaki. Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year, all students are expected to be fully compliant with the updated uniform requirements.

Tops

- Solid white long- or short-sleeve dress shirt (must be tucked in)
- Solid navy blazer
- *Optional:* Solid navy crewneck sweater (must be worn with dress shirt and blazer)
- *Optional:* Tie

Bottoms

- Khaki pants with black or brown belt OR
- Brownell Talbot plaid skirt

Footwear & Accessories

- Shoes that complement the uniform (boots, flip flops, slides, and sandals are not permitted)
- White, black, or navy socks (brand logos on socks permitted)
- *Optional:* White, black, or navy tights or tapered leggings (no flared leggings)

Students may continue wearing navy pants purchased before January 13, 2026, through the end of the 2026-2027 school year. All pants purchased on or after January 13, 2026, must be khaki. Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year, all students are expected to be fully compliant with the updated uniform requirements.

Competition Day Dress Code

Brownell Talbot encourages Upper School students participating in team activities to purchase an official travel warm-up set. Students may wear the following on competition days:

- Approved Brownell Talbot or co-op team/activity shirt or jersey
- Official BT warm-up jacket and pants OR daily dress code bottoms
- Shoes that complement the uniform (boots, flip flops, slides, and sandals are not permitted)

Note: On Wednesdays, formal uniform is required until after Chapel.



Upper School

The Fine Print: Daily Uniform

Formal dress options are acceptable and:

Tops

- Solid gray long- or short-sleeve polo shirt (must be tucked in; school logo is optional and it cannot feature any other logos or graphics) OR
- Seniors only: Black long- or short-sleeve polo shirt (must be tucked in and a solid color with no logos, graphics, or other details; school logo is optional and it cannot feature any other logos or graphics)
- Optional: Crewneck sweatshirt or quarter-zip from Raider Market (must be worn over required polo shirt)
- Optional: Navy or gray quarter-zip purchased from any retailer (must be solid color with no logos, graphics, or other details)
- Seniors only: Black quarter-zip purchased from any retailer (must be tucked in and a solid color with no logos, graphics, or other details)
- Optional: Approved team/activity and House crewneck sweatshirts or quarter-zips (must feature BT logo or school name, and have design approved by Dean of Upper School; must be worn over required polo shirt)
- Optional: logo'ed full-zip navy fleece from Raider Market

Bottoms

- Solid khaki pants with black or brown belt OR
- Solid khaki Bermuda-style shorts with black or brown belt OR
- Plaid uniform skirt or skort

Footwear & Accessories

- Shoes that complement the uniform (boots, flip flops, slides, and sandals are not permitted)
- White, black, or navy socks (brand logos on socks permitted)
- Optional: White, black, or navy tights or tapered leggings (no flared leggings)

Students may continue wearing green polos purchased before January 13, 2026, through the end of the 2026-2027 school year. All polos purchased on or after January 13, 2026, must be gray. Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year, all students are expected to be fully compliant with the updated uniform requirements.

- Solid white long- or short-sleeve dress shirt (must be tucked in)
- Solid navy blazer
- *Optional:* Solid navy crewneck sweater (must be worn with dress shirt and blazer)
- *Optional:* Tie

- Brownell Talbot plaid skirt

Footwear & Accessories

- Solid black, brown, tan, or navy leather dress shoes with no patterns
- White, black, or navy socks are required (brand logos on socks permitted)
- *Optional:* White, black, or navy tights or tapered leggings (no flared leggings)
